Family Promise of Tualatin Valley to Hold Open House

Tualatin, Oregon, February 28 – Family Promise of Tualatin Valley (FPTV) will hold an open house on Thursday, March 7 from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm. Executive Director Rose Money will be on hand to answer questions and provide information for interested parties. Program supporters and volunteers will also be present.

The Open House marks the beginning of the first operational year for FPTV. For the past two years, the group has been developing the program and forming the partnerships necessary to provide families with safe sleeping space, meals and supported access to resources for their path to sustainable housing. “Community collaboration for this much-needed program has been amazing,” according to Executive Director Rose Money. “Hundreds of volunteer hours were invested in renovating this day center, where families will shower, do laundry, care for children and work with us on their path to housing.”

The non-profit will provide services to families from the Tigard-Tualatin, Sherwood and Lake Oswego school districts, “We are excited to open our doors and start supporting our 236 homeless students and their families,” said Money.
